

Dear Parents:

Providence School's homecoming celebration will be October 19th, 20th, 21st, 22nd, and 23rd, 2009. On these days, students will be allowed to dress *in accordance with the day's theme*. These days are not considered "dress down days". Students who are not dressed according to the day's theme must be dressed in school uniform. Students out of dress code will be required to change clothes before returning to class.

Listed below are the themes for each day and a general outline of acceptable/unacceptable dress for each particular day. Obviously, we cannot list everything a student can or cannot wear. Therefore, the list is general and tries to cover the overall dress for the day. At no time are shorts acceptable. Sandals, open-toed shoes, backless shoes, or flip-flops are **only allowed** on the days specified below. **No** tank tops, spaghetti straps, low-cut tops, transparent, or "net-style" tops or tops where the midriff is showing when the hands are raised. Additionally, no cleavage should ever be showing. Stretchy, clingy or tight pants, as well as pants that have cuts or holes should be avoided. There should also be no printing or design across the backside of the pants. Graphic designs that depict secular bands, mystical figures or images that would conflict with the Christian life should not be worn. If there is an item that is *questionable*, please have your student show the clothing to one of the deans for an approval a day or two **before wearing** the clothing.

The administration will serve as final authority in matters related to dress code. Additionally, the administration reserves the right to require a student change clothes before being readmitted into class. Your cooperation is very much needed and appreciated in making this an enjoyable week for the students.

Monday, October 19 – (for grades 9-12 only) DECADES DAY

Students may wear clothing that depicts any twentieth century decade – the 1950's, 60's, 70's, etc.

Tuesday, October 20 – (for grades 9-12 only) PAJAMA DAY

Wear your best PJ's. Bedroom shoes, shower shoes, flip-flops, are all acceptable. Keep in mind PJ's should be loose fitting, not "clingy" or tight. Please no hair curlers or facial masks.

Wednesday, October 21 – grades 6-12 -- WACKY-TACKY DAY

Student may wear *tacky* attire. Students should not wear bathing suits, baggies, or shorts. Hats, caps, sweats, sunglasses and flip-flops may be worn.

Thursday, October 22– grades 6-12 -- COUNTRY/WESTERN DAY

Leave your horse parked in the corral. This day is for blue jeans and boots (or tennis shoes). Keep in mind blue jeans must meet the previously stated requirements. Remember **no weapons (including toy weapons)** are allowed on campus.

Friday, October 23 – grades 6-12 - STALLION SPIRIT DAY

Students should wear class t-shirts, Providence team shirts, or shirts with the Providence logo. Wearing school colors alone is not enough to pass for school spirit day attire.
