Rising 2nd graders: Reflex – two green lights per week Rising 3rd graders: Reflex three green lights per week


Rising 4th graders: ixl – Summer Boost Skill Plan twice per week Rising 5th graders: ixl – Summer Boost Skill Plan twice per week
